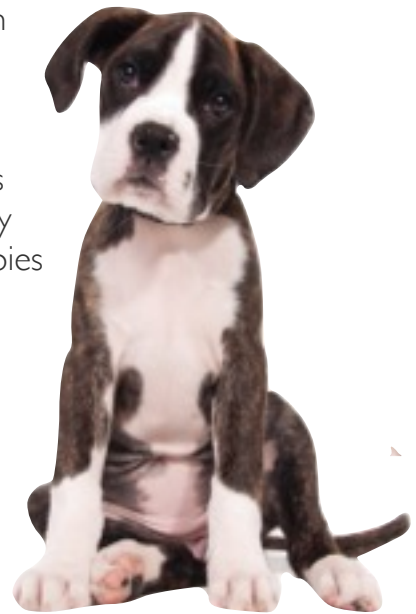
What to expect when you're expecting a foster dog...

Foster commitments come in all shapes and sizes!

Sometimes a pet with medical issues needs a quiet place to recover from an illness. Foster families who like quiet indoor time can be a perfect fit for a dog who needs some rest and recovery time. Other pets with tons of energy need to run and play a LOT. Fosters who love to exercise and get outside can provide great temporary homes for energetic dogs! Sometimes puppies just need a place to grow up and learn their manners and eventually get spayed or neutered. Fosters who enjoy puppy time are perfect for puppies in need of temporary homes!

Here are some things fosters do for pets in need:

- provide clean, safe indoor living environment
- provide fresh food, water and a comfy bed
- help with potty training and crate training (we have resources for this!)
- provide daily socialization (walks, play time, meeting people and other pets)
- help foster puppies and dogs become comfortable living in a home environment
- help foster puppies and dogs learn their company manners (sit for a treat; no jumping up; potty outside; shoes are not toys! - we have resources for this also!)
- watch for any medical changes or health concerns and report them to the foster coordinator immediately
- provide transportation for vet visits, scheduled vaccinations, adoption events, etc.
